Certainly the price was awarded for Giuliani's great Leadership in very difficult times, but how could the committee have forgotten everything what happened before September 11th? Had Rudy Giuliani, a man who was criticized especially in Germany for his merciless behaviour toward homeless people and minority groups, now also become a hero in Germany? Before deciding what kind of character Rudy Giuliani really is, it is important to take a closer look at his background and political career. Rudolph W. Giuliani was born in a working class family in Brooklyn, New York in 1944. He is the grandson of Italian immigrants. He attended Bishop Loughlin Memorial High School (Class of '61) in Brooklyn. In high school Giuliani had been what Americans call an "extracurricular activity junkie" (Barret and Fifield 34). He was a member of the baseball and weightlifting teams. He participated in a charity club, and even as a freshman he liked to take on responsibility and was voted homeroom president. As he grew older his interest in politics increased and he spent long nights with friends "discussing philosophy, religion and politics" (Barret and Fifield 35). In those discussions Giuliani always claimed to be a young man with very high moral standards. At the end of his senior year he was awarded "Class Politician" (Barret

and Fifield 36) by his classmates. At that time nobody could have known how right their decision was. In the fall of 1961 Giuliani enrolled in Manhattan College (Class of '65) in the Bronx. The atmosphere at the all-male college was similar to his high school. There was a mandatory dress code, tardiness was treated harshly, liquor was banned from campus and women were not allowed in the dormitories. Rudy Giuliani graduated in 1965 with honors but not with magna cum laude, a fact he often emphasizes. In the fall of 1965 Giuliani entered Law school at New York University (Barret and Fifield 37-41). Rudy was already politically active at that time and a classmate remembers him as a "real Robert F. Kennedy democrat, a liberal, except on law and order" (Barret and Fifield 53). Giuliani had deeply admired Bobby Kennedy and when he was murdered "[he] thought [his] presence in national politics was irreplaceable" (Barret and Fifield 55) []

### **Brooklyn Politicians**

On October 28, 1986, just one day after winning one of the most thrilling World Series in history, the New York Mets were feted by more than two million fans with a parade through the city. In news accounts of the event, there was a small aside, as this one in the New York Times: "Notable in his absence was the pitcher Dwight Gooden, who Mets officials later said had overslept." No, the Mets' twenty-one-year-old phenom had not slept too late. He had not slept at all, in fact. For Gooden, his postgame champagne celebration kicked off a cocaine binge that took him to a club in Long Island and wound up with him, wired, watching his teammates roll through the streets as he sat with strangers in a public housing project. Such were the 1980s in New York City, a gilded era buttressed by fast money from a real estate boom and the explosion of Wall Street wealth. The Mets and Giants, bolstered by lightning-rod personalities like Gooden and Lawrence Taylor, brought the city sporting glory while its celebrity wealthy added a tabloid-friendly touch of intrigue and national envy. Iconoclastic real estate developer Donald Trump gained national celebrity for his deal-making skill and the flaunting of his outsize ego. Even mayor Ed Koch had gained coast-to-coast fame and mention as a potential future president. Beneath the opulence was a tenuous foundation, one that collapsed spectacularly over the last half of the decade. Away from the cameras

focused on the city's nouvelle riches, New York was beset by crisis after crisis--homelessness, AIDS, crack cocaine, organized crime. The swell of outrage over the unwillingness of the city elite to address those problems took years to finally reach a tipping point. The authors paint vivid portraits of the men and women branded by the president's supporters as foes from the "deep state": Ukraine experts Fiona Hill and Lt. Col. Alexander Vindman; ambassadors Marie Yovanovitch and William Taylor. The narrative spools out amid Trump's nonstop tweeting and the infinite echo chamber of social media, which amplified both parties' messages in ways unknown during past impeachments. Sullivan and Jordan, aided by editor Steve Luxenberg, follow the story into the aftermath of Trump's acquittal and the president's payback for

those whom he believed had betrayed him. The retributions took place as the nation reeled from a devastating pandemic and widespread protests about racial injustice, with another trial looming: the 2020 election.

How did a scrawny black kid—the son of a barber and a domestic who grew up in Harlem and Trenton—become the 106th mayor of New York City? It's a remarkable journey. David Norman Dinkins was born in 1927, joined the Marine Corps in the waning days of World War II, went to Howard University on the G.I. The political career of David Dinkins is set against the backdrop of the rising influence of a broader demographic in New York politics, including far greater segments of the city's "gorgeous mosaic." After a brief stint as a New York assemblyman, Dinkins was nominated as a deputy mayor by Abe Beame in 1973,

but ultimately declined because he had not filed his income tax returns on time. Down but not out, he pursued his dedication to public service, first by serving as city clerk. In 1986, Dinkins was elected Manhattan borough president, and in 1989, he defeated Ed Koch and Rudy Giuliani to become mayor of New York City, the largest American city to elect an African American mayor. As the newly-elected mayor of a city in which crime had risen precipitously in the years prior to his taking office, Dinkins vowed to attack the problems and not the victims. Despite facing a budget deficit, he hired thousands of police officers, more than any other mayoral administration in the twentieth century, and launched the “Safe Streets, Safe City” program, which fundamentally changed how police fought crime. For the first time in decades, crime rates began to fall—a trend that continues to this day. Among his other major successes, Mayor Dinkins brokered a deal that kept the US Open Tennis Championships in New York—bringing hundreds of millions of dollars to the city annually—and launched the revitalization of Times Square after decades of decay, all the while deflecting criticism and some outright racism with a seemingly unflappable demeanor. Criticized by some for his handling of the Crown Heights riots in 1991, Dinkins describes in these pages a very different version of events. *A Mayor’s Life* is a revealing look at a devoted public servant and a New Yorker in love with his city, who led that city during tumultuous times.
